



**About the Sanctuary**

Asola Bhatti Wildlife Sanctuary is the only protected area (sanctuary) of Delhi, the capital city of India. It lies on the southeastern part of Delhi and is spread over an area of 6814 Acres or 28 square kms. The sanctuary plays a major role in absorbing pollution and acts as a carbon sink. Thus providing clean air to the citizens of Delhi. It also serves as a green lung for the concrete city of Delhi.

This protected area serves as an eco-heritage site for the country's oldest hill range-the Aravallis. Biogeographically, it falls in the Aravali hill range, which represents one of the ancient landforms of the world. Sanctuary has rocky and undulating terrain with many gullies. Ride through the steep gullies in the ancient Aravali hills to discover its biodiversity and history.

Earlier this area had a history of illegal mining for red bajri also known as badarpur. Thus the area came to be known as Bhatti mines. Several large open and deep pits across the sanctuary are abandoned mining pits which have now turned into lakes.

There are several ways to explore and enjoy the sanctuary; bicycle, vehicle and on foot.

**Do's and don't**

- Animals are generally shy and tend to hide when they see a human being. Please do not attempt to disturb or lure them out by throwing stones or other objects. Leave them in peace.
- Never feed, touch, or help wild animals. Remember, they are wild and can bite or scratch.
- If a wild animal appears sick, or hurts you, inform the forest department.
- Be aware of other motor vehicles while riding bicycles.
- Do not play music, honk or speak loudly. Silence can help you hear wildlife.
- Keep Flashlight of phones and cameras off all the time.
- Do not litter the sanctuary with polythene bags, tetra packs and other such materials. They not only spoil the beauty of the forest, but also may harm the animals. Take them back with you to be disposed off properly.
- Smoking is strictly prohibited.
- Pets are not allowed in the sanctuary premises.
- Do not collect any plants or animal remains. They belong to the forest and not in your gardens.

**Important:** Do not forget to carry mosquito repellent, sunscreen, hat, shoes and water bottle.

There is limited mobile reception in the forest.

**Any Camera/Recording gear Fee:** ₹10/- per unit  
 Cycle Rental: ₹100/- per hour  
**Guide for Cycling :** ₹500/- per person (entry allowed till 1 PM)
